Backpacks for Back to School

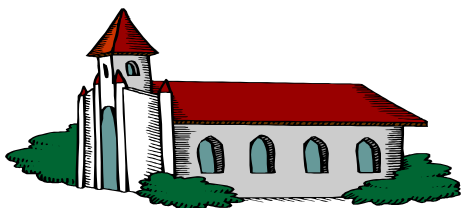

Here is the list of needs for this year: 1" or 1.5" 3 ring binders, loose leaf filler paper, tabbed dividers, spiral notebooks, pocket folders, #2 pencils, handheld pencil sharpeners, erasers, pens, 12" rulers, protractor or multi-piece drafting package, bottled glue, glue sticks, scotch tape, mini staplers, student scissors, crayons, colored pencils, washable color markers, pencil boxes or pouches, lunch boxes/snack bags for elementary school, dry erase markers, calculators for high school students, dictionary, index cards, book covers/book sox and new backpacks for boys and girls grade Kindergarten through 12th grade.
